FREE FOR THREE MINUTES, SUSPECT IS JAILED AGAIN AFTER FIVE-BLOCK CHASE

A Miami man was arrested twice Saturday morning, the second time after being apprehended by a citizen for allegedly stealing a woman's purse in the Dade County Jail parking lot.

According to Miami police, Terry Anderson, 28, was charged early Saturday morning with carrying a concealed weapon, a misdemeanor. He was released from jail on \$500 bond around 11:45 a.m., dressed in tight jeans, high-heeled shoes, a purse and a long black wig. Less than three minutes later, police said, he stole a purse from a woman sitting in a car across the street.

"I thought it was a woman, so I went after her," said the victim, who did not want to be identified. "It was probably a stupid thing to do."

Ed DuBois, a private investigator who was at the jail to administer a polygraph test, saw the incident and ran after them.

Anderson went back into the jail through the main entrance, apparently hid the stolen purse and ran out another door with the woman and DuBois in pursuit, police said.

DuBois said he and the woman got into his car and chased Anderson about five blocks before he ran into an alley. DuBois then followed him on foot.

"All this time I thought it was a woman," he said. "I grabbed at the purse he was carrying and he dropped it, but kept running. The next time I grabbed, I got hold of the long hair and the wig came off in my hand.

"That's when I realized it was a man."

DuBois finally tackled Anderson and wrestled with him for a few minutes. "He was clutching \$100 bills in his hands and screaming and biting," DuBois said. Neither man was seriously hurt in the struggle.

"By the time he

DuBois> got Anderson under control, there were about 10 persons standing around watching, but not getting involved," said Miami Police Sgt. Skip Bryant. "When police units arrived, he was sitting on
